Tracy's Corner

Well what an amazing year 2015 was! Our groups in Huntingdonshire, Fenland and Peterborough enjoyed some amazing opportunities over the last 12 months including: beach trip, trips to London, boat trips and trip to Abbotts Ripton Hall (thanks to Lady & Lord de Ramsey).

We couldn't do the majority of our events without external funding so we must thank all our funders who make this possible!

Cambridgeshire Tender

In October we were informed that Carers Trust Cambridgeshire had lost the tender to provide the Young Carers project in Fenland. Sadly this meant losing two members of the team - Debbie King and Mandy Brine, who have transferred to Centre 33, the new provider. However, we still do provide services in Huntingdonshire and take referrals as all our groups in Huntingdonshire have always been externally funded with the exception of the St Neots group.

Family Fund

One of the big highlights for us last summer was the Family Fun Fund. A small amount of money we received through Comic Relief to enable families to have a trip/day out/activity together. As you can imagine, this fund was oversubscribed and we tried to be as fair as possible so as many families could have an experience.

The feedback and pictures we received have proved that families had a great experience, so we will look to try and repeat this year.

Young Adult Carers

We have continued to support Young Adult Carers through **Take Action & Support**, a personal development project for Young Carers/ Young Adult Carers 16+ to support them in developing their skills for interviews, college and job applications. This fund has now finished but we are delighted to report that we received a substantial amount of funding to support YAC in Peterborough. We still support YAC throughout Cambridgeshire

Young Carers in Schools

We were delighted to co-host the regional Young Carers in Schools conference, which is a national programme to support schools in identifying and supporting Young Carer in schools. Find out more on page 8.

Funding

We have also been successful in a funding proposal that will support 15 Young Carers at 14-16 through planning for their future. This programme will support for one year and if successful will be continued.

Peterborough

Our Peterborough service has now moved into Thorpe Hall, and Carers Trust Peterborough has completed its first year, reaching and supporting more family carers than ever before.

There are as usual far too many things to discuss within a short word count, but from the team and myself, thank you to all our Young Carers, Young Adult Carers and families for your support. You inspire us everyday.





Carers Trust Norfolk

At the end of September, Carers Trust Cambridgeshire expanded its operations into Norfolk, establishing Carers Trust Norfolk, following the sad decision to close Crossroads Care East Anglia (CCEA).

The Norfolk Young Carers Forum (NYCF), funded by the Big Lottery Fund, and the Young Adult Carers support services, funded by Carers Trust, has also transferred to Carers Trust Cambridgeshire and are managed by Tracy Hyland.

YC Views Exchange

On 28th January NYCF held 'YC Views Exchange' their event for Young Carers Awareness Day.

This was hosted in partnership with the Outreach Department at University of East Anglia - the fourth time UEA and NYCF have worked together to host events for Young Carers and Young Adult Carers.



The event comprised an art exhibition - showing the 'Build A Person' artwork from a workshop run by forum members for 127 Young Carers at the Norfolk Young Carers Forum festival in August 2015.

The aim of the workshop was to give Young Carers the chance to talk together, sharing examples of good and poor practice to then build 'people' of significance in their lives. 'People' exhibited on the night included a social worker, teacher, college tutor, paramedic, GP, friends, YC Group Leaders, family members, mental health workers, police officers and 1:1 workers. In addition, the 'YC Superheroes' created by Young Carers aged 6-11 at the festival were on display as well.

Also at the event was a Young Carers Question Time. This lasted for one hour where Young Carers got to post questions to four panel members (Chloe Smith MP, Norwich North; Simon Vavasour GP; Linda Shepherd, Deputy Dean of Students at UEA and Councillor James Joyce, the Chair of the Children's Services Committee at Norfolk County Council.

47 Young Carers and Young Adult Carers from across Norfolk attended, supported to attend by workers from five services who provide Young Carer and Young Adult Carer support networks. 51 adult guests also came including professionals from Norfolk County Council, CAP, health services, Young Carers services, schools, UEA Ambassadors, county councillors and some parents.



Questions asked were:

- 1. "What do the panel understand or know about Young Carers and Young Adult Carers and about what we do"? Asked by Danielle from West Norfolk.
- 2. "Do panel members think there is a danger that the mental health needs of Young Carers are just dismissed as 'being a teenager' and not addressed properly?" Asked by Melissa from East Norfolk.
- 3. "Can you help fund more groups to help us relax, get a break and get away from trouble"? Asked by Hope from Norwich.
- 4. Young adult carers have previously waited up to 2 years for a carers assessment. The law has now changed and Young Carers can get an assessment too - do the panel feel confident this will happen quicker? Asked by Ricky from East Norfolk.
- 5. Do the panel think the housing needs of Young Adult Carers are understood? And do current budget cut proposals mean the situation could be about to get worse for us all not better? Asked by Catherine from mid-Norfolk.
- "Do you think there would ever be an allowance for Young Carers, where they get a weekly amount without their parent losing any of their own benefits?
 Many of our parents can't afford to give us any money". Asked by Emma from East Norfolk.

The debate was lively and a little heated at times audience members (Young Carers) also shared stories of struggling with their mental health issues, finding it difficult to get to school when they do not have sufficient money for bus fares and feeling that getting professionals to understand and engage can sometimes be hard especially when Young Carers and Young Adult Carers can lack confidence to speak up.

After the debate adults got to watch a film from Unit 23 about the Freefall project which can offer workshops to schools in Norfolk, Cambridgeshire and Suffolk while young people had the chance to look at their artwork and enjoy a buffet tea.

Look back on 2015 - Peterborough

Froglife



A group of Young Carers took part in Froglife's Green Pathways Project over four sessions, during Easter and Summer Holidays.

The aim of the project is to improve confidence, social skills, positive behaviour and transferrable conservation skills. Increase knowledge of the environment and enjoyment of the out doors.

The sessions had a maximum of six young people under 12 taking part in a mixture of activities at different locations. This included fossil hunting and bird watching at Kings Dyke;

hunting for snakes and tree climbing at Hampton Nature. They also took part in some community gardening at The Olive Branch Community Garden & Allotments, looking after plants and picking fruit and veg to take some home; pond dipping, arts and crafts and cooking some jacket potatoes and melting marshmallows on a bonfire. The final session was an outing to London Zoo to learn about the animals and how the keepers care for them.

Peterborough United

Thanks to the **Freekicks Foundation** we have been donated a season ticket for Peterborough United home matches, which are distributed to different families for each match who are interested in attending a game. This gives Young Carers the opportunity to have a one to one time with a loved one and a day out.



Mascot packages have also been gifted to the project throughout the year, our first one of the year was Josh who happened to be Freekicks 500 Mascot package! In July, seven young people were invited by Freekicks to a friendly match, as a sponsor package, which included a 3 course meal, meet the players, have a tour of the stadium, be part of the official match photo on the pitch and pick the man of the match.



Champions

So many great opportunities took place for our Young Carer Champions in 2015. In July we held a Champion's Hub Day at the Peterborough office for all YC Champions nationally, organised by Children's Society and Rethink. The Hub Day was around mental health and wellbeing, getting an understanding and knowing how to keep yourself safe and happy.

In August, our Champions were asked to take part in the Young Carer's Quality Assurance Panel for the Schools programme. This was a productive day looking at submissions from schools and the evidence to see what level they had achieved in supporting Young Carers.

In December, Sami was invited by The Children's Society to their annual Advent Service to give a short reading. She was then introduced to HRH The Duchess of Gloucester.



Young Carers in Schools



Young Carers in Schools programme is an exciting initiative that aims to make it as easy as possible for schools to support Young Carers and awards good practice. It is run jointly by Carers Trust and The Children's Society Young Carers in Focus partners and funded by The Queen's Trust and Big Lottery Fund.

Carers Trust Cambridgeshire appointed Tania Bingham to support and develop this programme with schools across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.



Introducing STRIVE Peterborough

Young Adult Carers Support – for those aged 16-25

The summer saw the start of designated support for Young Adult Carers aged 16+ in Peterborough arriving as an additional source of support for new & existing Young Carers. This support is tailored in its approach and you **CAN STILL** access YC Groups, Activities and support, you don't have to pick or choose - contact **Lisa** for more information.

We started off this new support and took a **STRIKE** at an evening of bowling. I must admit I thought I was rather good at it until I encountered the near professional skills of the group - there will be a rematch and I still think the person with the lowest score is the winner!!!



This support started with a designated project and a residential at Grafham Water. It kick started the project and brought a group of young people together for a team building trip away comprising of a series of challenging land and water based, mental and physical activities over three days. It also included a "fun" 10 mile (bottom numbing) bicycle ride around the reservoir through some beautiful woods and scenery and not forgetting up some major hills!!!!

The activities were aimed to push individuals through comfort zones, develop new skills and showcase strengths. It may have

been a tiring three days but I'm sure those who were there would agree it was also full of laughter!

Other highlights of the year have seen some creative workshops on emotional wellbeing taking place with a real focus on future planning. January sees us running Stand & Deliver - a free workshop to increase confidence in public speaking and planning presentations. 2016 will be a big year for Young Adult Carers in Peterborough and we hope you take advantage of this tailored support aimed to fit around your need, capacity and life goals!

There is more to the support we offer than just groups and 1:1 support; CTC and CTP has always believed in power and strength in the voice of Young Carers and Young Adult Carers. Over the summer some of you have been invited to share your experiences and feelings at several forums and events. In August we were



visited by Feylyn Lewis PHD, who is conducting national research with young adults alongside Professor Saul Becker at the University of Birmingham and wanted to interview Young Adult Carers about their caring experience. This was an amazing opportunity not only for the young people she met to be involved in but also for us to be part of such a project and share with Feylyn, a carer herself from America, ideas on how to improve and develop the support for and identification of young and Young Adult Carers when she returns back to the States.
