Young carers assessments

- Every young carer is entitled to an assessment of their needs under the Children and Families Act 2014
- This is irrespective of their age, who they care for or how much care they provide
- To request an assessment, call NCC Customer Services on 0344 800 8020.
- Young adult carers are also entitled to transitions assessments
- There is a guide to Young Carers Assessments (produced by Norfolk Young Carers Forum and Norfolk County Council).

Young adult carer transitions assessments

The transition assessment should support the young person and their family to plan for the future, by providing them with information about what they can expect.

All transition assessments must include an assessment of:

- Current needs for care and support and how these impact on wellbeing
- Whether the child or carer is likely to have needs for care and support after the child in question becomes 18
- If so, what those needs are likely to be, and which are likely to be eligible needs
- The outcomes the young person or carer wishes to achieve in day-to-day life and how care and support (and other matters) can contribute to achieving them.

Young adult carer transitions assessments

Transition assessments for young carers or adult carers must also specifically consider whether the carer:

- is able to care now and after the child in question turns 18;
- is willing to care now and will continue to after 18;
- works or wishes to do so;
- is or wishes to participate in education, training or recreation.
