#### Introduction

The East of England Integrated Stroke Delivery Networks (ISDNs) want to put **people affected** by **stroke** at the heart of everything we do.

Within the East of England (EoE) there are **two ISDNs** made up of stakeholders that are part of **six integrated care systems** (ICSs).

### EoE North ISDN:

Cambridgeshire and Peterborough ICS
Norfolk and Waveney ICS
Suffolk and North East Essex ICS

### EoE South ISDN:

Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes ICS
Hertfordshire and West Essex ICS
Mid and South Essex ICS

ICSs are **partnerships** that bring service providers and commissioners of NHS services **together** to **collectively plan** health and care.



### What are we planning to do?

To achieve this, we are **creating** an East of England **Stroke Patient** and **Carer Assurance Group.** Giving

people affected by stroke at any age, their carers and people at risk of stroke the opportunity to **contribute** to our **work**.

We want to **listen** to people affected by stroke to make sure the work we are doing is **right** for them.

### When we say involvement, we mean:

- Doing things with people with lived experience and those caring,
   rather than to or for them.
- This means stroke survivors and carers have a voice in conversations and decisions that affect them. They are seen as the experts.
- Giving people affected by stroke a say in our decision making and involves them in activities which directly influence our work.

### When we say assurance, we mean:

 That the work we are doing provides confidence to our governance board that the work is on track to deliver the intended benefits.



### Who we want to involve?

Patient and carer involvement will help **shape improvements** in stroke care.

- Involving stroke survivors, of all ages in discussions and decisions about stroke care is essential for developing stroke services that meet the needs of people affected by stroke including their families and carers.
- People at risk of stroke should be represented ensuring the full pathway of care from cardiovascular disease (CVD) prevention onward is represented.
- Under served groups and communities should be represented to ensure views are inclusive and wide reaching.

# Type of roles and requirements

We are looking to **recruit** a maximum of **twelve patient** and **carer** representatives who have been affected by stroke from across the region.

There will be a Chair and Vice-chair for the group.

All twelve representatives will need to attend six meetings per year (bimonthly) and each meeting will last approximately 2 hours.

There will be approximately **30 minutes** of **pre-reading** of papers before each meeting.

Meetings will be held on Microsoft Teams.

The **roles** will be for a period of **12 months** when there will be an opportunity to **review** the **membership** and extend for a further 12 months.

If any patient or carer should **require** any **reasonable adjustments** to be made to attend meetings or to read through papers, they must **discuss** their specific **requirements** with the ISDN management team at the **time of appointment**, who will endeavour to assist.

You can apply for both the unpaid and paid roles.

Figure 1 shows how the **EoE Stroke Patient** and **Carer Assurance Group** will **feed** into the **ISDN Boards** and the wider stroke patient involvement groups and vice versa.

### **ISDN** governance arrangements



# Responsibilities



# **Chair and Vice-Chair roles**

The **Chair** will be **responsible** for setting the agendas and **chairing** the group **meetings**. **The role** will be **paid £75** per Stroke Patient and Carer Assurance Group **meeting attended**.

In addition, the Chair will be responsible to attend two ISDN board meetings, four times a year (consecutive days for approximately 1.5hrs each days) and will be paid £75 per ISDN board meeting attended.

The **Vice-chair** will be responsible for **co-chairing** the group in the **absence** of the **Chair** including attendance of any ISDN board meetings. This role will reflect the same payment when standing in for the Chair.

The **patient** and **carer** representative roles will be **unpaid** but **reasonable** out of pocket expenses will be **covered**, if necessary.

# Additional responsibilities for the Chair and Vice-Chair

- Attend the quarterly ISDN Board meetings for the North & South.
   These will be virtual (IT support can be provided).
- Facilitate the discussions at board meetings and ensure all members views are listened to and heard.

- Update the ISDN Board on the outcomes of the EoE Stroke Patient and Carer Assurance group meetings.
- Update the patient and carer assurance group on the actions of the ISDN Boards.
- Invite members of the ISDN Board to the EoE Stroke Patient and Carer Assurance group as and when appropriate. This will enable the group to keep up to date with developments in all areas of the ISDNs work.
- Inform and support where necessary the ISDN management team and the Stroke Association engagement lead in relation to engaging with the wider community of people affected by stroke in the work of the ISDNs.
- Ensure agendas, minutes, topics, papers for each meeting are shared
  one week before each meeting and members are de-briefed if
  support is required after each meeting.

### All representative roles

 Participate in the EoE Stroke Patient and Carer Assurance group meetings six times a year. Each meeting will last approximately two hours. The meetings will be virtual via Microsoft Teams links (IT support can be provided).

- To be actively engaged with other people affected by stroke to keep well informed of what is important to them. This could be through local stroke support groups that you may be a member of or that you can engage with.
- Scrutinise the ISDNs work to ensure that it is based on what is important to people affected by stroke and includes appropriate plans for patient and carer involvement.
- Inform and support the ISDN's patient and carer involvement activities, helping to ensure that appropriate and effective practices are used.
- Review documents between meetings and provide feedback.
- To self-manage as a functioning group by providing peer support to each other through encouragement and knowledge sharing, offering support and guidance, sharing resources and assistance.

### Carer role

 Carers should have experience of living with or caring for someone affected by stroke. This role will unpaid but reimbursement for reasonable out of pocket expenses such as travel will be available.

### We are looking for people who

- Have experience of stroke; this could be personal experience or through supporting a family member/friend.
- Have an awareness of the health and social care system.
- Are able to **listen** closely and learn from other stroke survivors and carers (with support if needed).
- Have the ability to distinguish between personal views and those of others affected by stroke.
- Are able to think strategically.
- Are interested in improving health care.
- Can read and absorb complex information (with support if needed).
- Can confidently participate in group discussions and listen to and respect differing opinions.
- Are comfortable with asking and answering questions.
- Live within the East of England and the six localities.

### What we can offer for you

- The opportunity to work on regional (East of England)
   improvements to stroke care and treatment.
- Support, guidance and training to carry out your role effectively.
   This includes ensuring additional support or adjustments are provided, particularly for people with aphasia to ensure involvement is accessible to all.
- Reimbursement for reasonable out of pocket expenses such as travel.
- For the Chair and Vice-chair of the group a payment of £75 for every Assurance Group meeting they chair, and ISDN Board meeting attended.
