Definition of a Carer?

- A carer is anyone, including children and adults who looks after a family member, partner or friend who needs help because of their illness, frailty, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction and cannot cope without their support. (Source NHS England)
- * The care they give is unpaid.
- Young carers are children and young people under the age of 18
- Young adult carers are young people aged 16–25



- 49% struggling financially
- Social isolation common
- Covid19







Possible impacts of caring



- Low mood/ depression
- Stressed
- Over-tired
- Anxious
- Attachment issues
- Mature beyond years
- Resilient
- Organised and particular
- Clothing unclean/ unkempt
- Poor personal hygiene
- · Back/ neck ache
- Under or overweight
- Self-harm evidence (scars, disguising of body, pulling hair out, excessive nail biting)
- Pride in appearance



- Poor school/ college attendance
- Lack of aspiration/ planning for the future
- Poor relationships with peers
- Avoidance strategies of extra-curricular activities and trips
- · Secretive of home life
- Adult understanding of topics e.g. finances, household management, personal care
- Gravitation towards adult role models for friendships
- Lack of interest in education/ employment
- Poor behaviour perhaps aggressive, avoidant
- Socially isolated

According to the 2011 census, the average age of a young carer is 13



In Norfolk 5,570 carers under the age of 24 were identified in the 2011 census

Norfolk Insights, 2013



600 young carers and young adult carers reported they provided over 50 hours of care a week

Norfolk Insights 2017



On average young carers are caring for at least 4 years before anyone offers any help

Young Carers Needs Assessment

- All young carers are entitled to a carers needs assessment under Section 96 of the Children and Families Act 2014. Carers Matter Norfolk will do initial triage assessment.
- It can be requested by the young person, parent/guardian or professional.
- It doesn't matter how old they are, who they care for, or how much care they provide.
- Carer's Matter Norfolk are the front door of all services for both Young and Adult Carers in Norfolk

Benefits to NHS

- By early identification, and sign-posting to support, Health Care Professionals can help to prevent:
- Carers own physical and mental ill-health
- A caring crisis or breakdown in the caring situation
- * Hospital admission/re-admission
- Admission to residential care and the need for emergency respite.
